Burnt Sienna

Raw Umber— Daniel Smith only

Burnt Umber— Graham is good

Cadmium Reds or **Winsor Red**

Cadmium Orange and/or Perylene Orange or

Quinocrodone Gold or Orange

Permanent Magenta

Pthalo Green

Cobalt Blue— I recommend Daniel Smith
