

## Folds and Shadows: Mastering Drapery Painting

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## Materials:

- Paints (small tubes for starters) The essentials:
- Titanium white
- Ivory or Mars black
- Burnt umber
- Burnt sienna
- Cadmium red light
- Alizarin crimson
- Cadmium yellow med
- Yellow ochre
- Sap green
- Cobalt blue
- Ultramarine blue
- □ The supplements not necessary; best for accent colors and tinting the essentials:
- Zinc white,
- Titanium-Zinc (in oil only)
- □ titanium buff (aka: titan buff or unbleached titanium)
- Naples yellow
- Nickel yellow
- Veronese Green
- Cerulean blue
- □ Sevres blue (in acrylic it is Brilliant Blue)
- Prussian Blue
- Pthalo blue
- Teal/Cobalt Teal

- Quinacridone red
- Naphthol red
- Canvas, panels, or canvas board: for beginners 9" x 12" or 11" x 14; no larger than 16 in. x 20 in.
- Brushes the basics brush types are round, bright, flat and filbert
- Brushes (and mistakes) are our friends; treat them with respect and love and don't fear them. Learning what each style of brush does is best learned by trial and error. Buy too many brushes.
- □ All of these brushes can be used for either acrylic or oil paints.

- □ Start with a small, medium and large size of each type, as your budget allows.
- □ Small: #4 or #6 Medium: #8 Large: #10 or @12

- D Palette knife or Painting knife for mixing paints and for painting with
- □ Soft charcoal and a sketchbook
- Mediums, thinners We will use mine at first so you know what to buy
- For thinning paint as you paint, start with a pre-mixed commercial painting medium.
- Windsor Newton and Gamblin each make a good Blending/Glazing Oil Medium
- For cleaning brushes use an odorless paint thinner. Several brands are available at art supply stores.
