



Dripped Wax Resist with Watercolor

Materials:

- Watercolor paper (140lb cold press)
--You can buy it in blocks or in separate sheets and cut to desired size)
- A rigid supportive backboard slightly larger than your paper - (stiff cardboard is fine)
- Artist tape or masking tape
- Tubes of watercolor paint (artist grade preferred)
- Watercolor brushes
- A misting bottle
- A roll of paper towels
- Water jar or other container for rinsing brushes
- 2B pencil and a kneaded eraser
- An inexpensive sketchbook (for planning paintings and testing colors)
- White plate, tray or palette lid for mixing colors
- Containers for pooling separate wash colors (plastic cups or bowls or a muffin tin with areas openings large enough for a wash brush)
- Sea sponge
