Materials:
$\square$ Cold press watercolor pad, $9 \times 12$ inches, any brand
$\square$ Inexpensive bound sketch pad, 8 " $\times 10$ or $9 " \times 12$ "
$\square H, H B$ and 2B graphite pencils
$\square$ Kneaded and plastic erasers
$\square$ Masking tape, light colored
$\square$ Board or surface to tape paper onto
$\square$ A minimum of 8 professional-quality tubes of watercolor paint; small size tube is fine from Winsor \& Newton brand. Suggested colors that mix nicely for landscapes or use what colors you already have:
$\square$ Lemon Yellow
$\square$ Naples Yellow
$\square$ Scarlet Lake
$\square$ Permanent Rose
$\square$ French Ultramarine
$\square$ Cobalt Blue
$\square$ Burnt Sienna
$\square$ Optional but strongly suggested:
$\square$ Winsor Blue Green Shade
$\square$ Winsor Violet (Dioxazine)
$\square$ Antwerp Blue
$\square$ OR a set of professional quality watercolor paints in a pan format
$\square$ Palette to mix colors
$\square$ Synthetic Rounds Brushes, sizes \#2, \#4, \#6, \#10, plus a very small brush for details such as size 3/0 or other, Princeton SNAP! Series 9650 Golden Synthetic Brushes are reasonably priced
