

Dripped Wax Resist with Watercolor

Materials:

\Box Several sheets of watercolor paper (140 LB cold press)
(You can buy it in blocks or in separate sheets and cut
to desired size)
\square 2 or 3 stiff supportive backboards slightly larger than
your paper (stiff cardboard works)
☐ Artist tape or masking tape
☐ Watercolor paint (artist grade preferred)
\square Watercolor brushes including a wash brush
☐ Misting/Spray bottle
\square Roll of paper towels
\square 2 water jar or other container for rinsing brushes and
prewetting paper
\square 2B pencil and a kneaded eraser
\square Inexpensive sketchbook (for planning paintings and
testing colors)
☐ White plate, tray or watercolor palette for mixing colors

□ Containers for pooling separate wash colors (plastic
cups or bowls or a muffin tin with areas openings large
enough for your wash brush)
□ Small sea sponge
