## Painting Vivid and Vibrant Skies in Watercolor Lisa Lubarr

Materials:
☐ Graphite pencil (2B is fine)
□ <u>Eraser</u>
□ Watercolor paper:
☐ 140 or 300 lb Arches cold press watercolor paper
in block form (medium size block at least 9" x 12"
<u>or larger)</u>
OR
<ul> <li>1 or 2 large sheets (22x30) of Arches cold</li> <li>press paper to cut to smaller sizes. Other</li> <li>brands are also ok depending on your budget</li> <li>it is ideal to bring cold press paper due to its</li> </ul>
texture.
☐ Bring <u>masking or artist's tape</u> (if not using a
watercolor block) to adhere paper to drawing
board.

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☐ <u>Professional/artist-grade watercolor pigments in tubes</u> ,
suggested colors:
□ <u>Cadmium (or other similar) red</u>
□ <u>Ultramarine blue</u>
□ Cobalt blue
□ <u>Cadmium (or other similar) yellow</u>
□ <u>Burnt Sienna</u>
$\square$ Student grades are not as great for special effects,
but can still be used if best on your end.
☐ <u>Watercolor palette</u> , with at least 6 wells (more wells
preferable) and mixing surface.
$\square$ Watercolor brushes: ideally, 3 round brushes (small,
medium, large), suggested:
□ Round #2
□ <u>Round #6 or #8</u>
□ Round #12 or #14
☐ <u>flat brush approximately 1" or larger for washes.</u>
☐ Other assortments are great as well! It is fine to
begin with 3 or 4 brushes of assorted sizes.
$\square$ Two jars for water (bring from home)
$\square$ Fine mist spray bottle (re-purpose something from
home, or Holbein also makes a small 2 oz. plastic bottle
for watercolor artists).
☐ White tissues
$\square$ Reference photo(s) of skies that you like and would
love to learn to paint! It is ok if there is also land and/or

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water in the photo, as long as the sky is a focus. Instructor will also have some images on hand.

Optional Supplies:
□ <u>Watercolor masking fluid</u>
□ <u>Sea sponges</u>
☐ <u>Granulation medium</u>
☐ <u>Tabletop easel</u> or other support to paint on an angle
Instructor will also have these on hand to try.
☐ Optional tube pigments:
☐ <u>Alizarin crimson</u>
□ <u>Cerulean blue</u>
☐ <u>Viridian</u> or <u>Winsor Green</u>
□ <u>Burnt Umber</u>

☐ White gouache paint for opaque details
